Benefits of Social Capital and Social Infrastructure Measurement

Multiple benefits were identified by project

value to social ties.

Social infrastructure refers to the physical or online places and spaces that foster people connections categorised by community organisations, parks, social businesses and places of worship.



Libraries are Essential

Libraries offer everyone a trusted place to go to strengthen bonding, bridging and linking social ties.

The library connects all kinds of people by offering online access to connect those digitally disadvantaged, by running bushfire safety information sessions and as a place to go during events such as heatwaves. participants, including:

- Globally recognised evidence to support funding submissions, resource allocations and investment reviews, and advocacy for future change
- Opportunity to set benchmarks and measure impact over the long-term
- Overlaying social capital heatmapping and social infrastructure measurements with risk assessments and vulnerability data
- Transferrable data across many areas such as education, health and social services, and climate adaptation
- Connecting people data with grey infrastructure and other capital measures.

Pubs foster Connections

The local pub does much more than serve alcohol, being an important social business within a community.

Pubs employ local people, provide a space to connect for food, sport or fun and are often the first to open their doors to the community, government or emergency services in times of disaster.
